# Special Edition for National Family History Month



Alex Daw, our National Family History Month coordinator, has been working very successfully to provide a program and society opportunities for August 2023, National Family History Month.

#### **Opening Event**

The theme for National Family History Month this year is Secrets and Lies: using AI responsibly and handling sensitive subjects in your family history research.

To help kick us off a great month of family history events, we have **Professor Hamish Maxwell-Stewart** and **Andrew Redfern** looking at the pros and cons of using artificial intelligence in family history research.

Hamish Maxwell-Stewart is a professor of Heritage and Digital Humanities at the University of New England as well as the CEO of digital History Tasmania. An author of several award-winning books, Hamish works on the history of crime, health and work with a particular emphasis on convict transportation to Australia. He was instrumental in the creation of the Diploma in Family History at the University of Tasmania and continues to work closely with family historians to increase access to archives through the application of digital techniques.

Andrew Redfern is a passionate family historian and technology enthusiast. Since his initial interest in researching his family tree in the mid-1980s, Andrew has developed a deep interest in how technology can enhance the way we explore and preserve our family histories.
